| 8  | Great White Heron             | Ardea herodias occidentalis  | 2 | 3    | This is the white form of the Great Blue<br>Heron and we saw a few of these at both<br>Playa Larga salinas and also Cayo Coco |
| 9  | Great Egret                   | Ardea alba                   | 8 | 20   | Fairly common in wetlands and marshes as well as coastal salinas. Seen at many sites  |
| 10 | Reddish Egret                 | Egretta rufescens            | 3 | 7    | Great views were had at Playa Larga salinas including a couple of white morph birds   |
| 11 | Tricolored Heron              | Egretta tricolor             | 4 | 6    | Best views were had a Playa Larga salinas   |
| 12 | Little Blue Heron             | Egretta caerulea             | 7 | 60+  | We saw lots at Cayo Coco including many juvenile birds with a variety of white to mixed white and blue plumages               |
| 13 | Snowy Egret                   | Egretta thula                | 7 | 10   | Seen at many different wetland sites  |
| 14 | Western Cattle Egret          | Bubulcus ibis                | 7 | 40+  | Seen in many areas especially arable and wetlands associated with cattle as you would expect                                  |
| 15 | Green Heron                   | Butorides virescens          | 6 | 3    | Seen at a variety of sites including the ponds at Hacienda Cortina and the stream by the beach at our hotel on Cayo Coco      |
